

Fort Sumter - 1861





To commemorate this years show, the topic for our cachet envelope is the 150th anniversary of the start of the Civil War. The artwork for this cachet was done by club member Carol Petersen. This cachet coincides with the USPS issuance of two stamps in April, the first issues in the five-year series commemorating this conflict in American History. These first two stamps depict the attack on Fort Sumter and the battle at First Bull Run. Although not the first time a US stamp has commemorated the Civil War, the series is most appropriate for the sesquicentennial anniversary of this divisive conflict.

The first stamp depicting the attack and bombardment of Fort Sumter is taken from a Currier & Ives print. Fort Sumter, located in Charleston harbor, South Carolina, was a US garrison under the command of Maj. Robert Anderson. The newly established Confederate Government insisted that the federal fort belonged to the Confederacy while the Union states swore to "keep, possess and defend all property of the United States." President Lincoln informed Confederate President Jefferson Davis that he intended to resupply the fort with food and water but no military supplies, Davis ordered Gen. Beauregard to cut-off Fort Sumter and ask for Maj. Anderson's surrender. Anderson refused and on April 12, 1861 the barrage on Fort Sumter commenced. Anderson returned fire but on the 2nd day after 34 hours of constant bombardment, Maj. Anderson surrendered the fort. Following this attack on Fort Sumter, President Lincoln declared that the country was in a state of insurrection, avoiding the use of the word "war", and appealed for 75,000 volunteers for three months of military service.

By July of 1861, pressure on President Lincoln to bring a quick end to the rebellion of the southern states was mounting. Adding to the strain was the awareness by Lincoln that the 90 day enlistment of recruits who had responded to his call to arms after the attack on Fort Sumter was rapidly coming to an end. The first thrust by Union forces toward the Confederate capital in Richmond was headed by Brigadier General Irvin McDowell and 34,000 new recruits. McDowell met he counterpart, General Beauregard at Bull Run (the 2nd stamp in the series), a small creek located near Manassas, Virginia, on July 21st Both sides moved cautiously, with spectators coming down from Washington to observe the battle. What first appeared to be a victory for Union forces turned into a Confederate rout and a hastened Union retreat back to Washington, D.C.

As a result if the start of the conflict between the North and the South, the Federal Government in August 1861 demonetized and declared invalid all existing postage stamps in conjunction with the issuance of all new stamps to prevent the states in secession from using postage which they had in their possession.
