
After a brief intermission I Petersen presented an informative and well received slide show on his collection of Irish 1922 overprints.

Lancopex 2003 was a great success, with a large number of attendees. The dealers were pleased with the business they conducted, and many noted that for next year's show they would like another Saturday of teeming rain. USPS was busy for two days, the special show cachets and cancellations almost sold out, and the Youth Table was usually hopping. There was plenty of free philatelic literature and enough door prizes for a drawing almost every half hour.



"The other teachers were as amazed as I was," she reported, and they want to continue this work next year.


I met with many in attendance, some of whom had traveled quite a distance for the show. A principal from a Christian school brought a group of students from Stamp Club that he had started. And one

of last year's new members, Diane Meek, a middle school art teacher, plans to start a club at her school next fall.




