How about those 3-D stamps! Specially designed cameras similar to the stereo type camera are used. to produce these unusual shots. An emulsion overlay that looks like corrugated plastic gives the extra depth.

Coming issues of new U.S. stamps are: March 15..Washington, D.C. 20013, 6¢ American Legic 50th anniversary; May 5..Houston, Texas 77002, 6¢ Apollo 8 Mission. Coming issues of new U.N. stamps are: February 10..6¢ and 13¢ UNITAR commemoratives; March 14..6¢ and 15¢ ECLA Building, Santiago, new 10¢ airmail stamp and 13¢ definitive stamp; April 21..6¢ and 13¢ "Peace through international law."

A 4 value stamp set, commemorating the first anniversary of the world's first successful heart transplant, was issued by the Yemen Arab Republic.

A new U.N. slogan cancellation "Research and Development" will be first used on February 24. Send self-addressed stamped envelopes (U.N. stamps) to United Nations Postal Administration, United Nations, New York, N.Y. 10017. Mark "slogan" on the outside envelope. Enclose a medium weight filler in each envelope.

United States - Scott #244, \$4.00 value, in good color and condition are worth at least \$325.

Great Britain - Scott # 251, George VI 10 sh. indigo, is rapidly rising in price because of great demand.

Canada - Scott #278-281, George VI set, is hard to find. The 2¢ brown coil is the most difficult to find.

Japan - Scott 378 A, miniature sheet issued to commemorate the 75th Anniversary of the Government Postal Service in Japan, is very scarce.

Gibraltar - Scott 107-118, George VI issue, is rising in price. Gibraltar has "come into vogue".
