Cinderellas, Cinderellas, All I Want Are Cinderellas...

This is not the same wording as the Disney tune, but we stamp collectors can sing this song of hope.

Cinderellas present thousands of ways to collect stamps...they are another whole universe of possibilities.

The Cinderella Club, organized in 1959, has members who study these fascinating stamps.

The 45-paged staple-bound A
Glossary of Terms for the Collector of
United States Stamps from the United
States Stamp Society defines cinderella
as "a nickname frequently used for
fantasy labels with no postal validity."

I have a much broader idea that a cinderella is an item that looks like a postage stamp but is not.

The Cinderella Club has a laundry list of philatelic items that fit in this specialty, but this list is not complete.

Included are local stamps, telegraph and railway stamps, revenues, fiscals, forgeries, and bogus and phantom issues.

Christmas seals and TB and other charity stamps are cinderellas, as well as registration seals, and advertising and exhibition labels.

One type not listed are the old commercial savings stamps, such as S&H Green Stamps. I remember getting tons of them at the grocery store and my mother affixing them to books, then turning them in at the "Green Stamp Store" in the plaza on North Fifth Street.

The Cinderella Club has dues of \$25 annually and is based in Great Britain. Unfortunately, most of the activities are restricted to British residents. Sad, as they have about four or five annual day-long meetings in London and judging from the website they must be a treat for philatelists.

The library and circuits are likewise British-bound, but the journal may be worth the membership and U. S. members get that.

Local Leesport stamp dealer, Keith Jackson, is a significant dealer in revenue and related items from the world of cinderellas.



The above is listed as "1T5 remainder" in F-VF condition on Keith's website. This beautiful cinderella is only twenty cents and demonstrates why collectors find this field so attractive. A nice essay was only \$75.00. While there are many great rarities, a beautiful collection can be built on a m
