You Never Know What You Can Find

Sometimes I don't know if I collect stamps to connect with history or study history to connect with stamps. Probably, both.

The above cover is an example. I found it about ten years ago in a circuit from the American Philatelic Society specializing in 19th Century (1800's) U. S. covers.

The material comes in booklets with deep pockets to keep the covers from flopping around and when I turned the page to this gem all I saw was "O. C." That immediately rang a LOUD bell in my head.

I grabbed the cover to pull it out and saw "Yale." Holy Moly! And then, the Chicago postmark. Can't be, I thought, then I read "College" and I knew I had a treasure.

O. C. Marsh was Othniel Charles Marsh, one of the most important paleontologists of the late 1800's. Attaining prominence at Yale, his

rich uncle financed luxurious Peabody Museum to house his finds. Marsh described over 500 species in his lifetime including such dinosaurs as Triceratops ("horned" dinosaur), Stegosaurus (with "plates" on its back), Allosaurus (a small tyrannosaur) and Apatosaurus (what we called Brontosaurus in the 1960's).

The "Chicago" was significant because Marsh nearly annually sent diggers to the west to unearth these creatures. The last jumping off point was the Windy City. No doubt one of his men dropped him a last minute Spring note before heading out.
