## Forever Rates

## Forever Higher

Don't blink, postage rates could rise as early as September, when the regulatory committee may vote to give the Postal Service more leeway in pricing.

Now tied to inflation, rates could be based on need. After ten straight years of loss, the Postal Service has been crushed under requirements to "pre-fund" retiree health benefits.

And, the Postal Service claims a need to invest billions in new, more efficient delivery trucks.

Coupled with the fact that first class mail volume has dropped $\mathbf{2 7 \%}$ in the last ten years, mere inflation-based increases fell short by over five billion dollars the last four years.

Double-digit increases in package deliveries have not filled in the gap.

Think about this, if rate increases sufficiently surpass inflation levels, buying stamps for future use could be a smart business move.

Consider this, if you bought stamps years ago at the four-cent rate, it would now take eleven of them plus an additional three cents to send a basic first class letter.

But imagine this, had those stamps been "forever" stamps you would be paying four cents for a 49-cent service!

Perhaps in the far future, no forever stamps will ever be sold at discount!

## Philatelic Phirsts!

Thought our readers may enjoy these philatelic tidbits:

What was the first philatelic item to be collected by the Smithsonian Institute? Answer: A pane of 10-cent Confederate Stamps was donated in 1886. It is amazing that so many years went by until a stamp-related item was received.

Who was the first identifiable woman depicted on a U. S. postage stamp? Answer: Queen Isabella was portrayed on an 1893 Columbian stamp.

Then, who was the first identifiable American woman pictured on a U. S. stamp? Answer: Martha Washington in 1902.

Who was the first identifiable Native American honored to be on a stamp? Answer: Pocahontas made philatelic history when she appeared on a U. S. Stamp in 1907. Other first Americans were shown on stamps but not as individuals.

This one really fooled your editor. Who as the first identifiable Hispanic American on a U. S. Stamp? Answer: Admiral David Farragut's father was from an island in the Mediterranean owned by Spain and the admiral himself was depicted on a 1903 stamp.
