
V-MAIL (VICTORY MAIL) WW II FACTS

- The United States adopted the Airograph Service from England, renaming it "Victory Mail" or "V-Mail,"
- The U.S. Post Office Department separated mail by respective Army and Navy Units and delivered it to the V-Mail stations, which were under military jurisdiction
- V-Mail stations were established in New York City, San Francisco, Chicago, and in various locations overseas
- Postage was free to the service person mailing a letter or post card
- More than a billion V-Mail letters were delivered between June 15, 1942 and November 1, 1945, when the V-Mail service ended

V-MAIL (VICTORY MAIL) WW II FACTS


- V-Mail reduce the volume of mail sent to the war front saving over 5 million cargo pounds for essential war supplies such as:
 - ✓ 2,298,280 units of Army K-Rations
 - √ 496,428 Garand Automatic Rifles
 - ✓ 1,323,809 units of Blood Plasma
 - ✓ 51,711 packages of Surgical Dressings

V-Mail Process



- Where it had taken up to a month for standard mail delivery by ship, V-Mail delivery could take as little as twelve days or less using aircraft
- The service persons overseas uses the same process for writing letters home, except for their postage was free
- If the V-Mail was mailed within the U.S. to a U.S. address it was not microfilmed but was still censored


