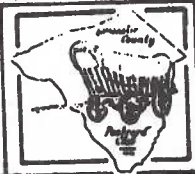

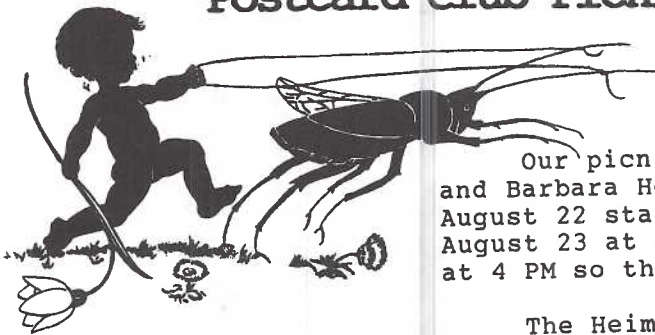

Second Annual Lancaster County Postcard Club Picnic



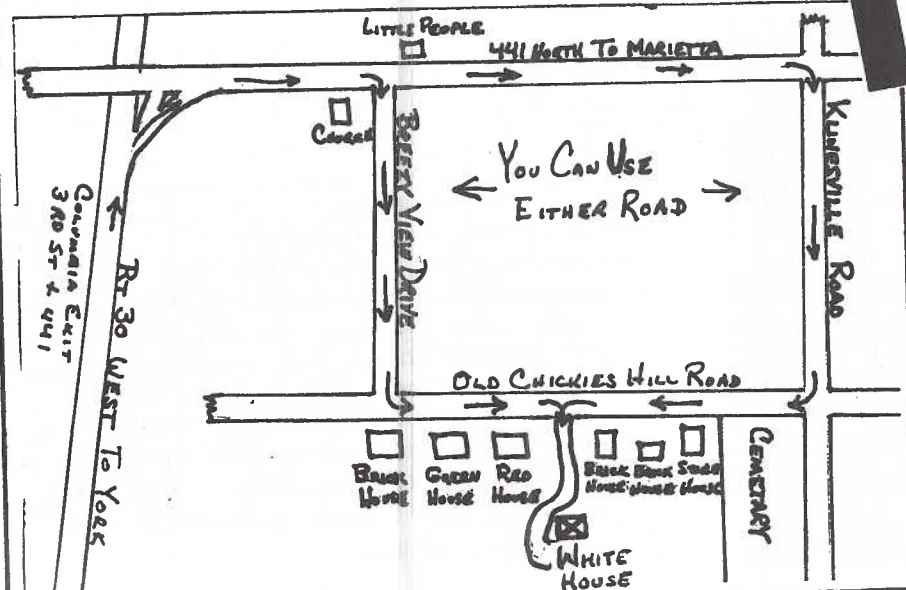
Welcome to the beautiful world of old postcard silhouettes. By Anna Schirmer, Elsbeth Forck and the unknown artist above.

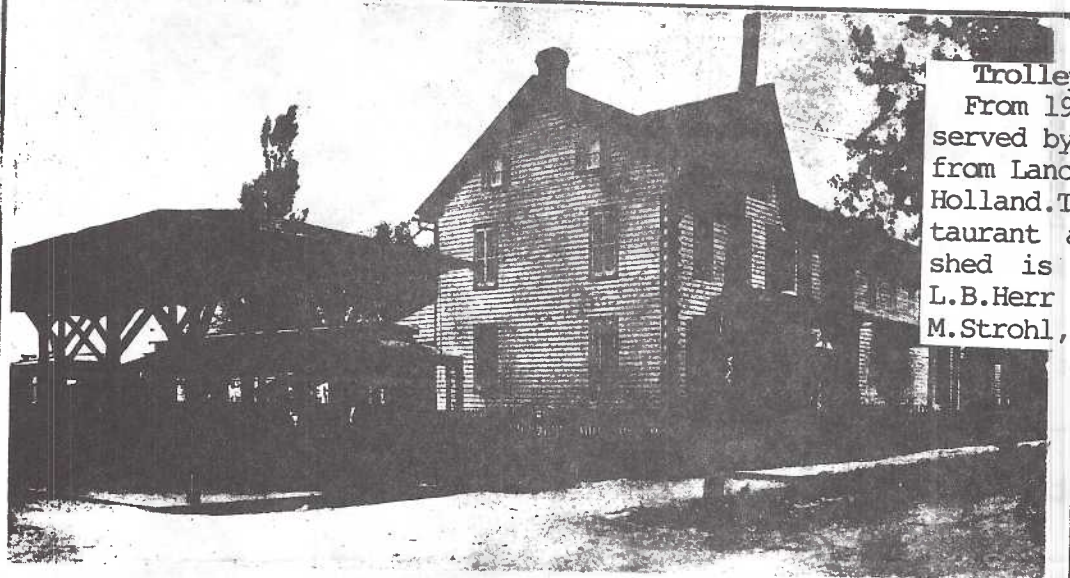

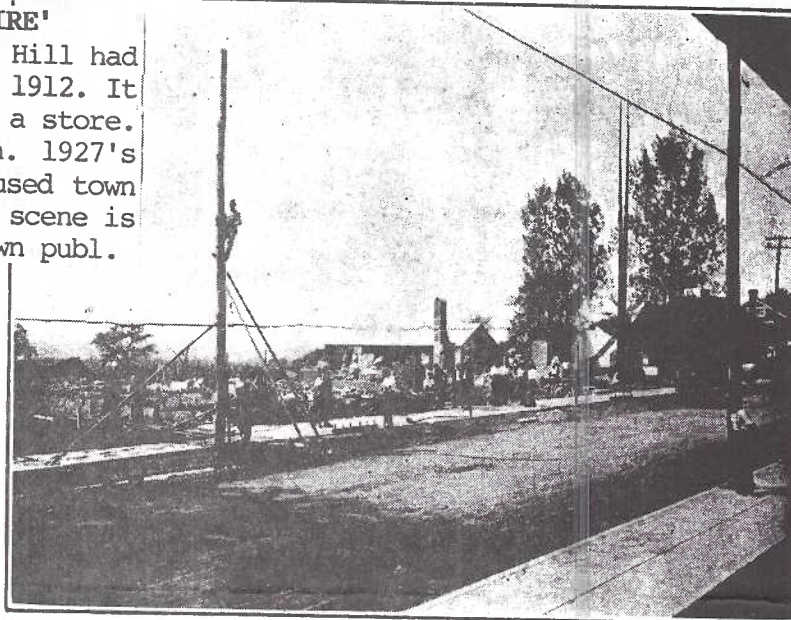


TERMINUS OF LANCASTER AND TERRE HILL TROLLEY ROAD, TERRE HILL, PA.

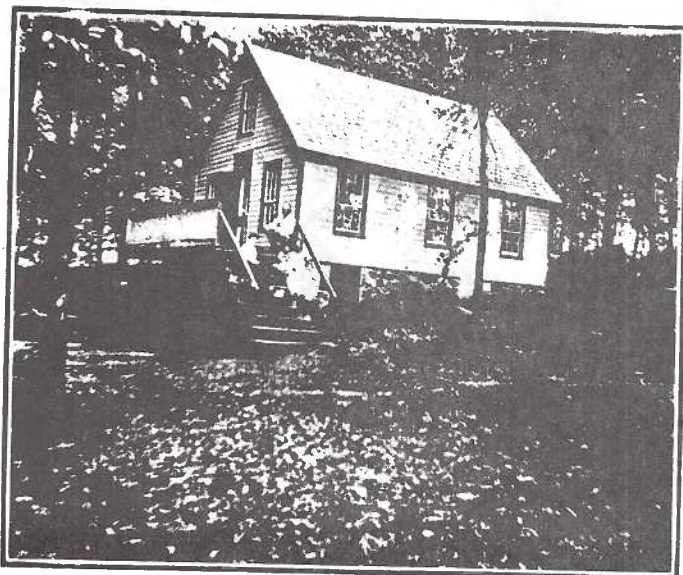
Trolley Service to Terre Hill
From 1905 to 1932 Terre Hill was served by Conestoga Traction Co. from Lanc. thru Blue Ball and New Holland. Terminus was Slater's Restaurant at 111 W. Main St. Trolley shed is now part of town park. L.B. Herr un/back PC was mailed to M. Strohl, Ephrata, on Feb. 28, 1907.

FIRST T.H. 'GREAT FIRE'

The little town of Terre Hill had its first 'great' fire in 1912. It destroyed three homes and a store. Scene looks west on Main. 1927's \$100,000 fire finally caused town to lay water system. This scene is approx. 136 W. Main. Unknown publ.

Camp Volunteer

It served the town for many summers as a religious retreat. In 1909, from July 10 to 22, Col. and Mrs. Herron (Phila.) led services and Lonnie Lawrence Dennis the "Famous Boy Preacher" conducted 2 services each day. PC mailed to Ida Shreiner in Lititz, Oct. 14, 1909. Express Printing of Lititz published the PC w/div. back.

As is the case with many towns, **Terre Hill** began with a different name. **FAIRVILLE**, the U.S. Post Office found, was also a Chester Co. town name and so the residents in 1850 chose **Terre Hill** when it's first Post Office opened. For ten years (12/1/1895-12/1/1905) it was **Terrehill**.

The major 'industry' changed from hand-rolled cigars to children's and ladies' apparel, but the composition and population size of **Terre Hill** has changed little over the last 100 years. It incorporated as a boro 9/6/07.

A short pleasant drive to **Terre Hill** is not complete until you've seen the town's pride and joy -the Town Clock Building. It has served as a school, a fire department, a furniture store, a cigar factory, a millinery shop and truck terminal. The town council purchased the historic building in 1977 and after complete restoration uses it as a very handsome Borough Hall.

Combine 1 cup mayonnaise or salad dressing, ½ cup finely chopped Heinz Sweet Pickles, 1½ teaspoons lemon juice, 1 teaspoon grated onion. Cover; chill to blend flavors. Serve as a sauce for baked, broiled or fried fish, or a sandwich. Makes about 1½ cups.

CARNIVAL CHEESE SPREAD

2 cups grated American or process sharp cheese (½ pound)
 ½ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing
 2 tablespoons sweet pickle liquid
 ½ cup finely chopped Heinz Sweet Pickles
 3 tablespoons finely chopped pimiento

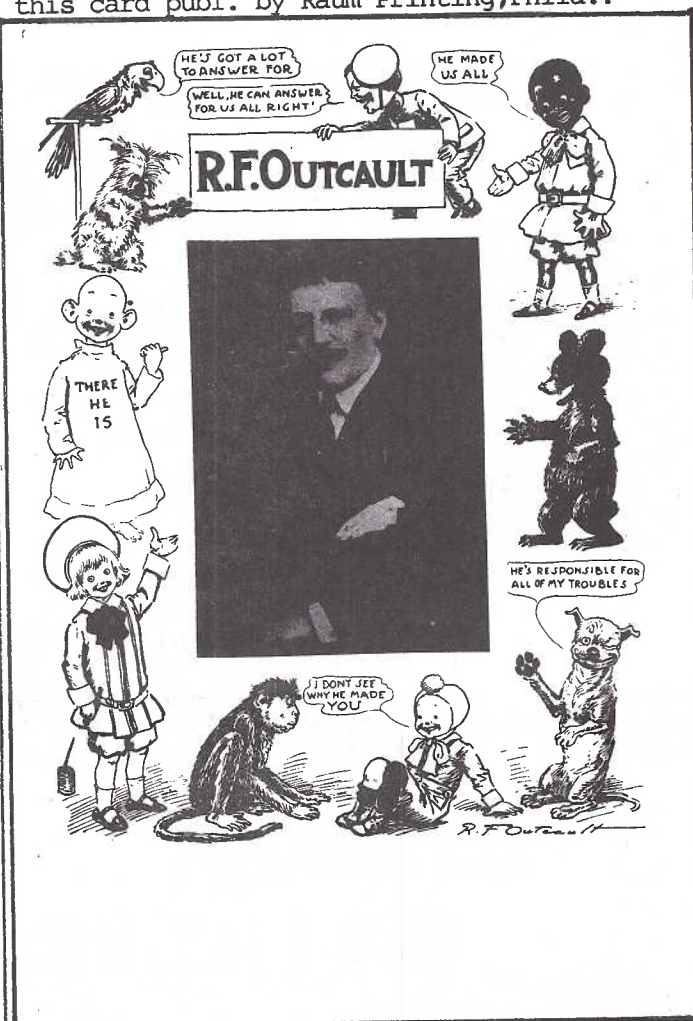
In small bowl of electric mixer, beat cheese on low speed about 1 minute or until partly creamy. Continue beating while adding mayonnaise and pickle liquid. Increase speed and beat until light and fluffy. Stir in pickles and pimiento. Cover; chill to blend flavors. Serve as a spread for sandwiches or crackers. Makes about 2¼ cups.

Combine ½ cup dairy sour cream, ½ cup mayonnaise or salad dressing, ½ cup finely chopped Heinz Dill Pickles. Cover; chill to blend flavors. Serve with raw vegetables, or as a sauce for fish or tomato slices. Makes about 1 cup.

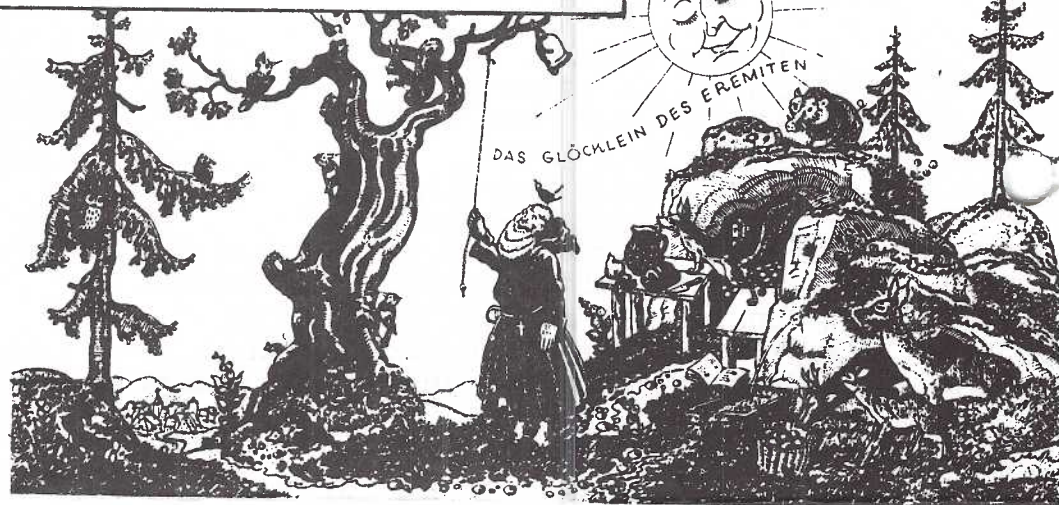
These beautiful multi-colored PCs are titled **GLOCKENABEND** or **Night of the Chimes** And captioned in German as well as English.

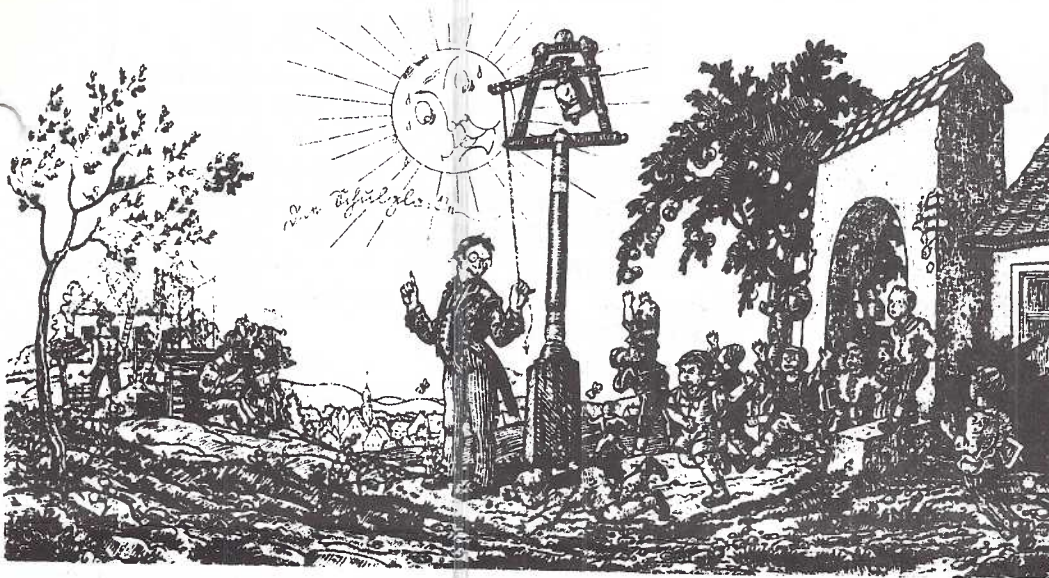

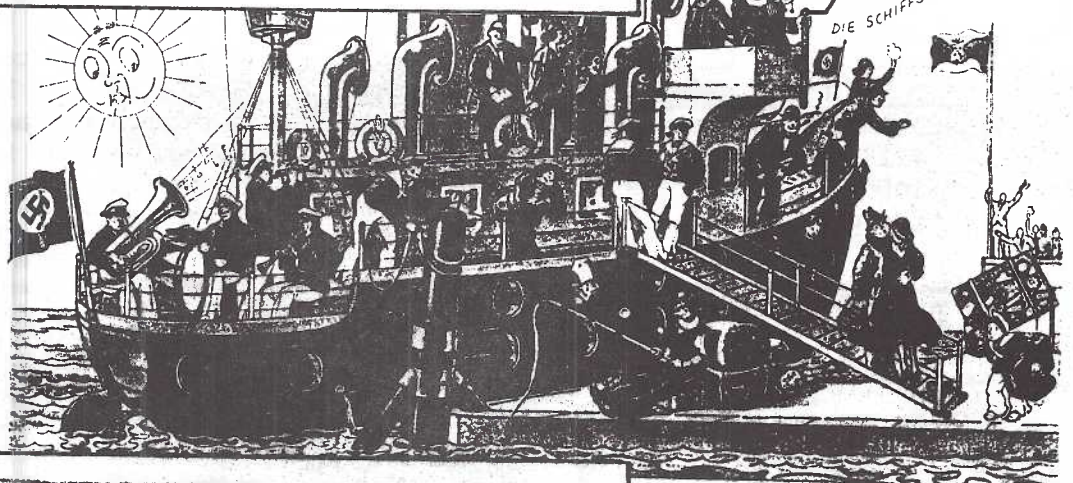
