Also, members were asked to vote on board topics for the Expo. There were ballots with a list of subjects and members were asked to select four. Door prizes of \$2 vouchers were won by Ruth Frankhouser and Betty Beck. The 50-50 prize of \$11 went to Renata Sachse.

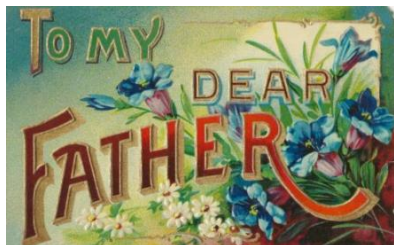
The program was given by Mark Abrogast entitled "The Construction of Safe Harbor Dam, 1930-1931" with acknowledgements to the Conestoga Area Historical Society for their materials. Mark's talk spanned the time before, during, and after the dam's construction. It was estimated that 2,000 workers helped construct the dam in two years. The Lancaster Conservancy will be offering tours of Safe Harbor on June 4, covering history of the dam's power generation, grounds management, access to the river, fish lifts and much more. Details are available on their website. Currently, the dam is owned by Brookfield Renewables.

Since there was no further business following Mark's talk, the meeting was adjourned.

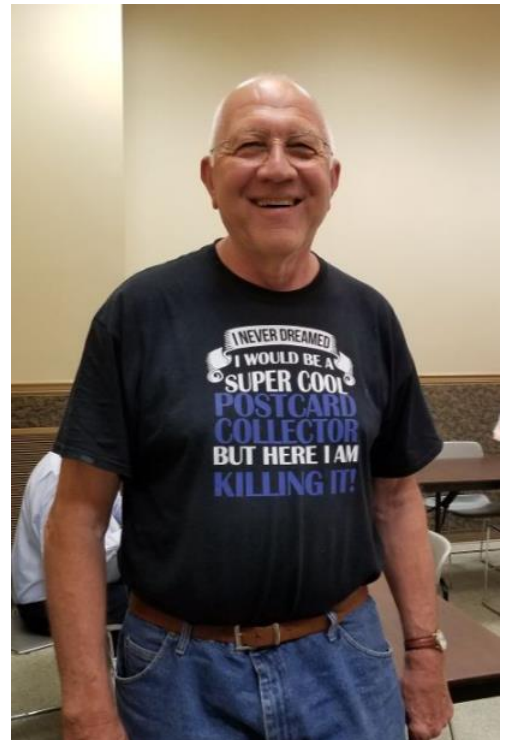

MANUEL WIELANDT

(No. 8 in a Series on Signed Artists)

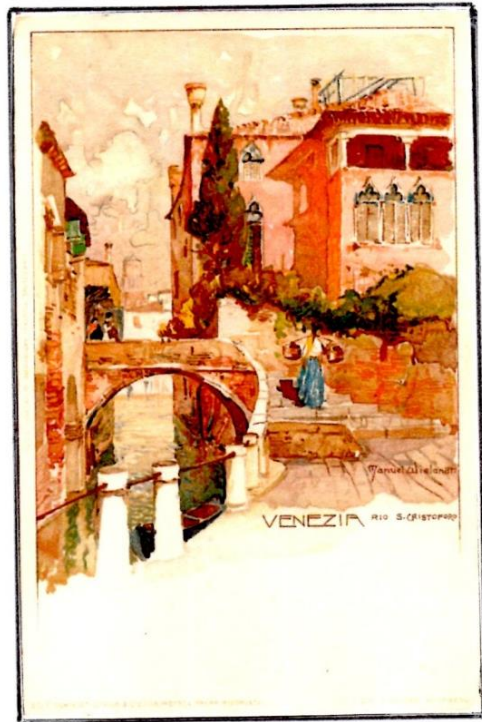
Manuel Wielandt was born in Lowenstein, Germany in 1863. He was educated in Stuttgart and Karlsruhe, Germany. He liked to paint scenes when he was abroad and his favorite travel areas were the French and Italian Rivas.

He never intended to be a postcard artist but thanks to his publishers Velten and Ernest Nister we have much of his art work preserved on postcards.

It is generally acknowledged that there are a total of 106 Wielandt postcards comprised of four sets of 25 postcards of the Riviera and one set of 6 scenes from Germany.

He died in 1922.

MUNICH

Munich is the largest city and the capitol of Bavaria in southern Germany. It was first settled in the year 1158 on the banks of the Isar River next to a monastery belonging to the Benedictine monks. For this reason it included a monk in the city coat of arms.

Over the years, the monk has been transformed into a child dressed in the monk's habit. He appears all over the city on postcards and beer steins and all other kinds of souvenirs.

Below are pictured two postcards of Munich's favorite child by Ottmar Zieher along with other things the city is famous for i.e. the Frauen Church and beer and bratwurst as consumed at the yearly Oktoberfest.
