LANCOPEX '93 CACHET/CANCELLATION

Lancopex '93 commemorates the entry of the United States into the Space Age 35 years ago. On January 31, 1958, four months after the Soviet Union launched Sputnik 1, a 31-lb satellite, Explorer 1, was thrust successfully into orbit. The U.S. had planned to hoist the first satellite using a Navy Vanguard rocket but after several failures the Army received permission to launch Explorer 1 using a modified Redstone rocket called Jupiter C. In Explorer 1, developed by James Van Allen, a Geiger counter registered areas of intense radiation around the earth. These bands of radiation were later named the Van Allen Radiation Belts in honor of their discoverer, Van Allen. Explorer 1 orbited the earth 58,000 times staying in orbit for 12 years.

Each space launch has resulted in scientific discoveries. Today in stationary orbits at 23,000 miles above the earth are telephone communication satellites, TV repeaters, industrial communication satellites, and a nearly completed navigational system. In lower polar orbits, circling the earth every 1 1/2 hours, are military (spy) satellites, weather monitors, the Hubble telescope, space lab, and space shuttle. All transmit information back to earth.

Our everyday lives have been influenced by the developments in metallurgy, propulsion, medical instrumentation, weather studies, origin of the universe, vegetation growth, food packaging, airline safety, new materials such as plastics or ceramics, and microcircuitry -- all outgrowths of the technology needed for the space programs. Apollo 11 in July 1969 resulted in Neil Armstrong walking on the moon. The Mariner, Ranger, Pioneer, and Viking programs have sent spacecraft to explore our solar system and beyond.

More than 1,100 U.S. space launches have followed Explorer 1, over 84 of them with humans aboard. "But for those who helped to make history on January 31, 1958, little Explorer 1 is still the most thrilling of all." (Marcia Dunn, AP Aerospace writer 3/31/93) Lancopex '93 thanks those engineers and space pioneers whose vision created the Space Age.

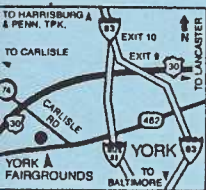

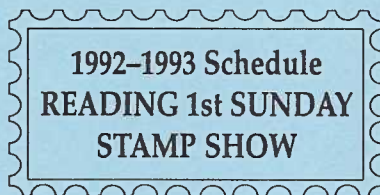
