

OCTOBER PROGRAM

The Schuylkill Navigation system, also commonly referred to as the Schuylkill Canal, was a series of locks, dams, slackwater pools and canal sections on the Schuylkill River in southeastern Pennsylvania. It was developed in the 1800s for the primary purpose of transporting coal from the mines in Schuylkill County to Philadelphia. By the early 1900s, when commercial traffic had diminished substantially, the slowed waters of the canal and dammed river sections were frequently used for recreational purposes. Aaron Heckler will share with us a selection of postcards from Berks County relating to this waterway."




A FEW BLACK CAT SUPERSTITIONS
