


Charles Ezren Jr.


Eugene E. Gene Sowers


GOOD YEAR!









Dudley Buxton was a popular English cartoonist. Some history helps in our first sample. Helligoland (Helgoland) is an island in the North Sea. It was taken from Denmark by the British Naval Force in 1807. The British later traded it to Germany for some use rights in German East Africa. The Germans then turned the island into a popular vacation spot years before WWI. That was when Buxton drew this cartoon of our little Brit was asking for his German friend, Fritz to "come out and play". An that was made easy since the royal leaders of each country were friendly cousins — then.

These court-size (3 ½" x 4 ¼") cards are unusual Dudley Buxton examples of his humor. He is shown as The Goode Baron Dudley Grahumbugge Buxton, waiting for hys fayre Ladye Rowena on a PC dated September 3, 1908 mailed from Hastings, England. On a second PC, also mailed in 1908, the message (beginning on the reverse reads, "You tell me to grow fat! I'm afraid you don't realize that if I were fat I would look something like this! Anyhow, dear, if you wish it I will do my best." (Dudley was in reality, thin as a rail.)

It was a cold night on January 22,1990 when 21 postcard collectors met at Stauffer Mansion at the invitation of our friend Jim Ward.

The group seemed to click at the very first meeting because we had this burning desire to collect and share our knowledge of postcards. These rectangles of cardboard covered with pictures and scenes seemed insignificant to our families and acquaintances, but we knew better. We were eager to learn more about publishers, artists, cancellations, geographics and history. Ah, history!

I'd like to think that the first 21 members should be called the "First Comers", as the passengers of the Mayflower were called when they landed on a bleak December 11, 1620 (Julian calendar).

It was not until the early 1800's that the very name "Pilgrim" came into common usage. The Pilgrims had no name for themselves as a group. Neither did our group (until the second meeting).

Incidentally, the first signer of the Mayflower Compact and the unanimously elected first governor of Plymouth Plantation was Deacon John Carver.Our second president was the Rev. Earl Carver.

It was Mary Darrenkamp who suggested we have name tags.

In February,1991 President Earl Carver surprised PastPres. Jim Ward by presenting him, on behalf of ICPC, the club's first (and thus far, only) Honorary Life Membership. He said it was for Jim's efforts in organizing the fellowship that we enjoy today.
