## German Censorship of Civilian Mail during World War II

The following is a list of all the major German censorship stations which operated during WWII. The purpose is to provide the identifying code of each station, the starting and ending date for operations and the areas of responsibility – i.e. region covered by that station. The areas covered by the stations varied over time, as more stations came on line. The stations were also moved as the Allies advanced.
