








Bridget "Biddy" Mason (1818-1891) was born on Robert Smith's plantation in Hancock, Georgia. Thirty-eight years were spent in bondage, four of them in California, before she finally received her freedom. On January 19, 1856, the United States District Court in Los Angeles emancipated Biddy Mason, her three daughters, and ten other African-American women and children. Immediately following the emancipation decree, Biddy Mason was offered a job as a midwife and nurse by a Los Angeles doctor who had become interested in the litigation. Saving carefully, she was one of the first African Americans to purchase land in Los Angeles. As a business-woman Biddy Mason amassed a small fortune of nearly \$300,000, which she shared generously with charities. She was instrumental in founding a traveler's aid center, an elementary school for Black children, and was a founding member of First African Methodist Episcopal Church, the city's first and oldest Black church.

Limited stamps on your want list?




- Start new/expansion of parts of your thematic collection.
