OVERVIEW

As there had already been a "Jubilee Stamp Issue" some three years earlier in 1887 in honor of Queen Victoria's reign, the Post Office did not want to have another issue for the Jubilee of the Introduction of the Penny Post.

Instead they decided to hold several events and issued Postcards instead.

The events were as follows:

May 16th, 17th and 19th 1890:

A Conversazione and Exhibition held at the Guildhall, London

Conversazione held on the evening of May 16th with 3,000 specially invited guests, including the Prince of Wales.

Exhibition open to general public in 17th and 19th with 21,000 attending.

A special postcard was issued: 10,000 printed and plate destroyed. Special cancel for the event.

July 2nd 1890. (Evening Only) and celebrated throughout the country.

A Conversazione and Exhibition held at the South Kensington Museum. An evening event only attended by 4,000 paying guests. Attendees included Duke of Edinburgh

Special Envelope with insert issued and five (5) special cancels.

Envelope was available throughout the United Kingdom on July 2nd only.

40,000 Envelopes and Inserts printed: plate was destroyed.








Guidhall, London - Built in 1440

Only 5,000 of these postcards were available on the night of May 16th.





Guildhall Postcards with Cancels for all three dates

On the first evening only 5,000 of the 10,000 postcards were available. With 20,000 visitors they sold out so quickly that Post Office Employees had to go to nearby post offices to get 15,000 regular post cards in order to satisfy demand.

Hence the example below for May 16th is a regular postcard but the May 17th cancel is on a "Special Jubilee" postcard one of the other 5,000 available.





Below is a drawing of the drawing of the loading of the Mail Coach to Brighton.






An extract from the Official Account of the Celebration of the Jubilee of the Uniform Penny Postage (Pages 224 and 225)

An ex-guard of the London and Exeter mail coach, who began his duties in the year 1836, presented to the Duchess of Edinburgh a letter signed by old officers of the Post Office who entered the service more than fifty years ago, the first signature being that of Mr. Frederick Hill, the sole surviving brother of the late Sir Rowland Hill, and another signature being that of an officer of the Post Office, Mr. R. S, White, who entered the service in the year 1818.

This letter was as follows:

"May it please your Royal and Imperial Highness, we, the undersigned, who are old officers of the Post Office, desire to welcome your Royal and Imperial Highness to this, the celebration of the Jubilee of Uniform Penny Postage. We desire to thank your Royal and Imperial Highness for your condescension in coming amongst the officers of the Post Office and in lending approval to the Rowland Hill Benevolent Fund by your gracious presence."

Tube Cancels were a novelty and nothing to do with the London Underground. Pneumatic tubes were installed so that patrons could have an envelope sent for 1 penny from the 1890 Post Office to the far end of the Architectural Court, where they could pick it up, or they could pay 3 pence and get a different cancel to have the envelope returned to the 1890 Post Office

This postcard may not look special but it is a rarity.

It has cancels from the three different Post Offices, 1790,1890 and 1990 at the Conversazione all dated July 2nd 1890

What makes this card unique?

It has two cancels for 1890. The smaller size is not referenced in the "Official Account"



CARDS MAILED OUTSIDE OF LONDON

MAILED ON JULY 3rd 1890 from WAKEFIELD YORKSHIRE to WINCHESTER

Cancel is a good example of the WAKEFIELD Town Square Cancel.

Below is an excerpt for Wakefield taken from the Official Account of the "Celebration of the Jubilee of Uniform Penny Postage".

WAKEFIELD.

The officials and stuployes mustered to the number of over fifty, and Mr. Pye (the Postmaster) thanked them for coming so readily and in such numbers, and asked them to join in wishing that Her Most Gracious Majesty neight long live to reigh over as, and to show this by three times three. The Post-Office band led the company in the singing of the National Anthem, and the cheers were given as only Yorkshire voices can give them.

The oldest man in this part of the service, John Crossley, caused much marriment by his "speech." Mr. Crossley joined the service in 1831. The Postmaster then read a short account showing the wonderful development of the Post-Office work under the system of uniform postage.

Mr. Milnes having proposed a vote of thanks to the Posttnaster, this most interesting and enthusiastic gathering separated, the presence of the lady telegraphies having added a certain charm to the pleasing some.

Inserts were not meant to be mailed separately. They did not include Postage. However they were mailed and the recipient had to pay two pence in order to get the card.



The note on the reverse makes an interesting reference to the Post Offices at the Exhibition for 1790 (see nest page for illustration) and 1990.

No illustration has been found for the 1990 Post Office.



Sent Registered Mail with four additional pence postage. Note 4 in blue at top right.

Card arrived February 19th per Altona back stamp (see below right)



Altona is located in the banks of the Elbe River and is now a suburb of Hamburg. Before 1870 it was part of Holstein / Prussia, while Hamburg was a City State. (ref map on left).

The picture below depicts a street in Altona looking from Hamburg made about 1890. It shows two posts that denoted the border between Hamburg (City State) and Altona (Holstein)







1890 Cover mailed on September 13th
1927 from East London to Apolda,
Thuring, Germany. It has an extra 2
and ½ pence postage.

It was mailed from Willy Jacoby a small London Stamp Dealer to Gebruder Michel in Apolda, home of the Michel Catalogues.

Power and Sons Architects was formed in 1873 by John Power and his son Joseph.

In 1840 Kingston becomes the capital of the United Province of Canada.

John Power was an English Architect who immigrated to Kingston in 1846.

John became Kingston City Architect in 1866 dying in office in 1882.

He had designed bridges, hotels and many churches and schools for the city.

Even today there are guided tour of buildings designed by John and his Son.

Mailed on July 11th 1890 in Bolton the envelope is back-stamped in Kingston ON Canada on July 21st and 22nd





Moybray Ayers attends the Conversazione on July 2nd 1890. On February 25th 1942 he decides to mail it to himself in Streatham, adding an extra two and one half pence stamp. Envelope is canceled on in Streatham on February 26th at 9am

The address is changed to Kingston on Thames, Surrey and the additional stamp is canceled over 5 years later on April 18th 1947.

Who received it and what happened to it in the intervening years is unknown.




1890 JUBILEE ENVELOPES WITH MODERN USAGE
