

Monday, March 9th, 1936

The regular semi-monthly meeting of the Lancaster Stamp Club was held on the above date in the Y.M.C.A. promptly at 8 P.M. There were 18 members and two visitors in attendance. The president, Thomas A. Keller, was in charge.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by the secretary and approved as read.

A bill for \$ 1.37 for postage was presented by the secretary and ordered paid.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
