

April 13th, 1936

The regular semi-monthly meeting of the Lancaster Stamp Club was held on the above date in the Y.M.C.A. at 8 P.M. There were 22 members and two visitors in attendance. The president, Thomas A. Keller was in charge.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

The treasurer reported the balance on hand as of March 9th to be \$ 9.58 with receipts of \$.50; expenditures of \$ 7.53; and a balance of \$ 2.55.

The chairman of the Publicity Committee reported about the International Stamp Exhibition in New York, May 9th to 17th, and the special train rates there on May 10th. Mr. Mentzer reported that the program for the evening would be an auction.

Correspondence was received from the West Chester Stamp Club extending an invitation to members to attend an annual dinner. Also, from Laurence Hendry of the York Stamp Club, inviting us to exhibit and attend their annual Exhibit, May 6th to 9th. Various other notices were received all of which were ordered filed.

Mr. Keller read portions of a Postal Bulletin giving information on the first flight of the Hindenburg, The Rhode Island Tercentenary Stamp and the sheet of four stamps to be issued at the International Stamp Exhibit.

Mr. Oscar Miller read a communication from a flood sufferer in Johnstown, Pa. who was also a brother philatelist.

A bill for \$1.28 for postage was presented by the secretary and ordered paid.

Mr. Thomas A. Keller resigned as president of the club after commenting on several derogatory remarks made after the last meeting. After some discussion, Albert F. Witmer was appointed chairman of a committee to contact Mr. Keller and to ask him to reconsider his action.

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

There were 42 auction lots offered for sale. The amount of the gross receipts was \$ 10.50. The auctioneer was Albert F. Witmer.
