A 1934 Cover with a History





Rarely will you find a cover with a history like this. Mailed from Berkeley, CA, in December, 1934 to Capetown, South Africa. Forwarded to Middlesex, England. Returned by way of London, England, to New York in May, 1935. The 1934 Seal was tied to the back of the Cover by a "Return to Sender" stamp. This shows that a Postal Cancel is not the only way to tie a seal. Shortly, you will see another method that was used during World War II. This cover now resides in the collection of the prominent Philatelic Correspondent, John M. Hotchner, who collects 1934 Seals and collateral items.
































