Whether you are wearing the colors – like our three little patriots are doing, or displaying them grandly like our images of Columbia are doing - be sure to remind the world that America represents freedom for everyone.

It was June 14,1777 when Congress passed a resolution defining the colors and symbolism of the Stars and Stripes. President Wilson proclaimed the official observance in 1916. President Calvin Coolidge reiterated the same in 1927, but it wasn't until 1949 that it became a national holiday when President Harry S. Truman signed Flag Day as a national holiday.
