
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THOSE SILENT FILM STARS OF 1922

The year was 1922 when the Max Sheffer Company in Chicago published a set of 50 postcards entitled "Kings and Queens Movie Series". That was exactly 100 years ago and about five years before the first talking pictures were introduced in movie theatres.

Who were the movie stars of this long ago time? We present some brief biographies of stars pictured in this series.



BUSTER KEATON
Harry Houdini name him
Buster after a fall. Toured
vaudeville with parents.
Inherited a movie studio
from disgraced actor
Fatty Arbuckle. Produced
his own films. Famed for
physical comedy done
with deadpan expression.

CHARLIE CHAPLIN
The Tramp in silent films.
"The Kid" with Jackie
Coogan. Wives Paulette
Goddard and Oona
O'Neill. Late to talkies.
Did "The Great Dictator"
Became too political.
In Switzerland for years.
Honorary award in 1972.

BEBE DANIELS
A child star. Acted with Valentino. Mostly in musicals, they not popular after 1930.
She was involved in a stalking case and moved to England.
With husband on radio shows in World War II.







ERICH VON STROHEIM

Austria-American actor and director. One of the early great directors, his films were full of sophisticated plots but ran way too long. Fought with studios, finally banned as director. Famous for movie "Greed".

MARY MILES MINTER

Over career made some 50 films. She was star in "Anne of Green Gables" directed by Wm. Desmond Taylor. They had an affair. He was murdered in 1922, the case never was solved. She quit acting in 1923.



WILLIAM S. HART

The original screen cowboy. Always forthright and honest. But his career was damaged by a paternity suit which was later dismissed. By that time, Tom Mix and Hoot Gibson were the popular western leads and his career never recovered.

CONSTANCE TALMADGE

She was the sister of movie stars Norma and Natalie Talmadge. Her speciality was in romantic comedies. A famous role was Mountain Girl in D. W. Griffith's movie "Intolerance". All three sisters quit acting when talkies came along – their Brooklyn accents would not work well in sound.





LILA LEE

Leading lady of silent films. Worked with Gloria Swanson and Valentino. One of few stars to make transition to talkies. But reputation ruined in the mid 1930's when fiancé Reid Russell was found dead at her home. The case was never solved.

MARY PHILBIN

Famed for beauty and the beast type roles. She was Christine opposite Lon Chaney in "Phantom of the Opera" and Dea in "The Man Who Laughs".

RUDOLPH VALENTINO

He was the heartthrob of the 1920's. Known as The Latin Lover. Famous roles were in the movies "Four Horsemen of the Apocalypse". "The Sheik" and "Blood and Sand". He was born in Italy and never became a U.S. citizen. Died at the young age of 31.





JULY 7 – WORLD CHOCOLATE DAY By Jim Ward

How could we possibly pass up Hershey Chocolate products when we feature chocolate on postcards?

The postcards that backed Hershey bars in the early 1900s are VERY collectible! They've been discussed on these pages before, but we'll show you several of the more difficult ones to find







The reverse of the one showing the little mail carrier reads: "If interested, return this card with your address on the other side and we will send you free a few choice recipes showing how to use Hershey Cocoa in several delightful ways....Our factory is open to visitors at all times." (The sender had only to add a postage stamp to the pre-addressed postcard.)









In 1883 Milton S. Hershey started the Lancaster Caramel Company and part of this factory still stands on South Lime Street in Lancaster. He sold the company in 1900 for one million dollars to start the Hershey Chocolate Company. Through trial and error he created his own formula for milk chocolate and produced the first Hershey bar.

Unable to have children of his own, Milton Hershey founded the Hershey Industrial School in 1909. Following his death a \$90 million trust was established along with 40% common stock of the company to ensure the success of the school.



Hershey Chocolate also produces Reese's Peanut Butter cups, M&Ms, Rolo Bonbons, Kit Kat bars, Cadbury brands, Twizzlers, Pay Day bars, Mini Almond Joys, Take 5, Mounds, Krackel bars, and of course, Hershey Kisses.
