



BEARD DAYOR NOT By Jim Ward

September 3rd was International Beard Day. It's long gone now, so let's celebrate Beards-Coming-Off Day" instead. And our grinning little tyke shows us the instrument of choice for millions of men for several generations – the Gillette Safety Razor – "No stropping, No Honing."


King Camp Gillette imagined the idea of a safety razor in 1895, developing that into a working model that could be submitted to the <u>Patent Office</u> took six years. Gillette and other members of the project founded The American Safety Razor Company on September 28, 1901. During its first year of operation, the company had sold 51 razors and 168 blades, but the second year saw sales rise to 90,884 razors and 123,648 blades. The company was renamed the Gillette Safety Razor Company in 1904



Supposedly the 5-0'clock shadow, dirty looking, faces we see today began more than a generation ago when film producers wanted their star of Miami Vice, Don Johnson, to look more rugged – more macho. The popular TV show set trends in fashion, and music for years. And the Dirty Face was its longest lasting product. Ugh.
