Postcard Stories

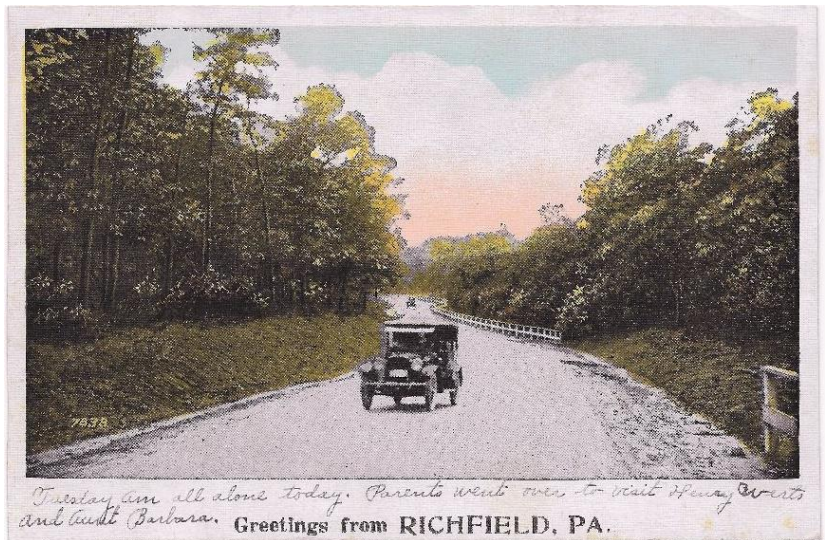

Searching the backs of postcards can be as exciting and satisfying as searching for vanished scenes or rare images.

During the first decades of the twentieth century, postcards recorded the progress of individual lives in all parts of the country.

With electronic databases accessible from any computer, one can find romance, tragedy, drama, scandal, heartbreak, and happiness in the lives of postcard correspondents. This program is the telling of stories introduced on the backs of postcards.

Many of the postcards were purchased at meetings and exhibitions of the Lancaster Postcard Club. A brief introduction to creating an on-line catalog of postcard collections will also be made.



Boy Scouts of America Official Postcards

The Boy Scouts of America were organized in 1911. The first activity cards were released - 1913 through 1916. There were 30 cards in the series and they were printed by Schlesinger Brother and Company, NYC> The cars were printed using the photo offset method and there were three printings during this timeframe. All were printed with same obverse with slightly differing reverse, thereby allowing one to determine each printing. The order of printing is not known.

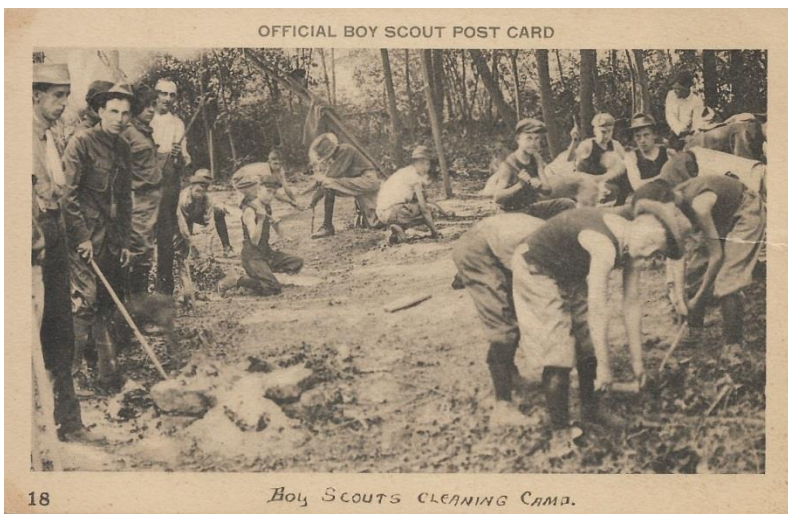

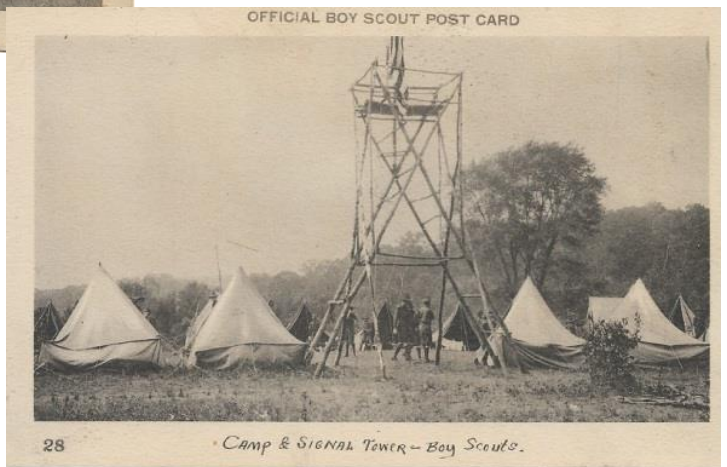
Scout Law

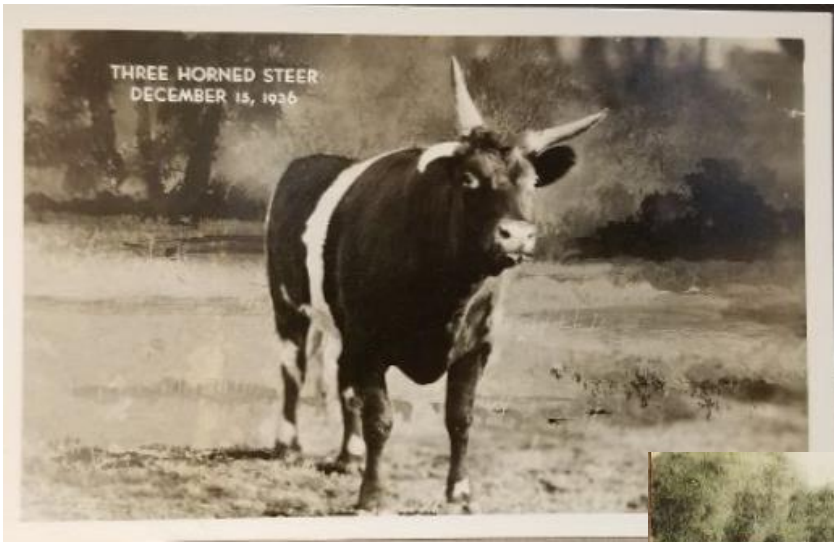
