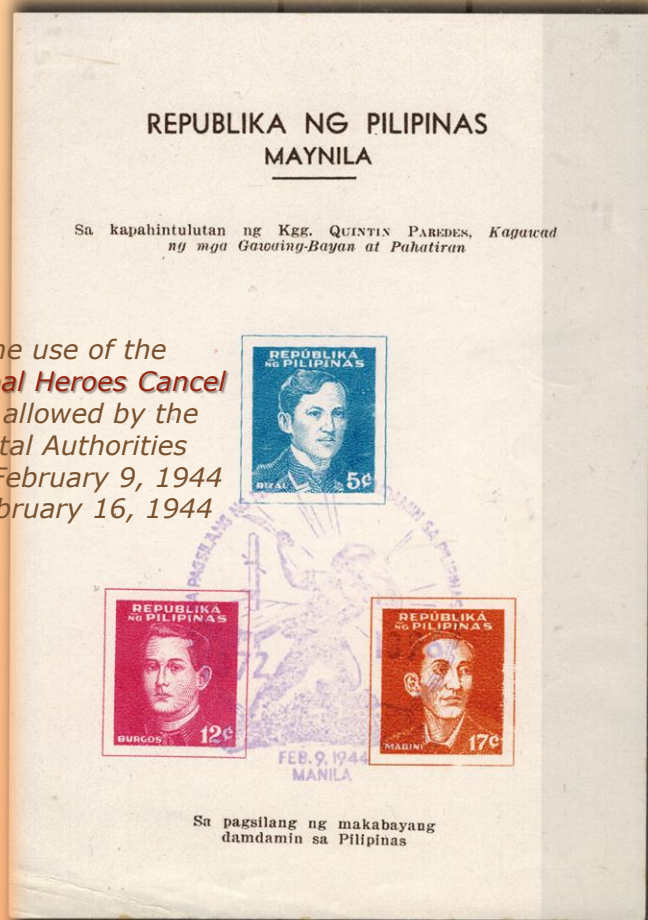

 - Apolinario Mabini (17c Orange) - a national hero

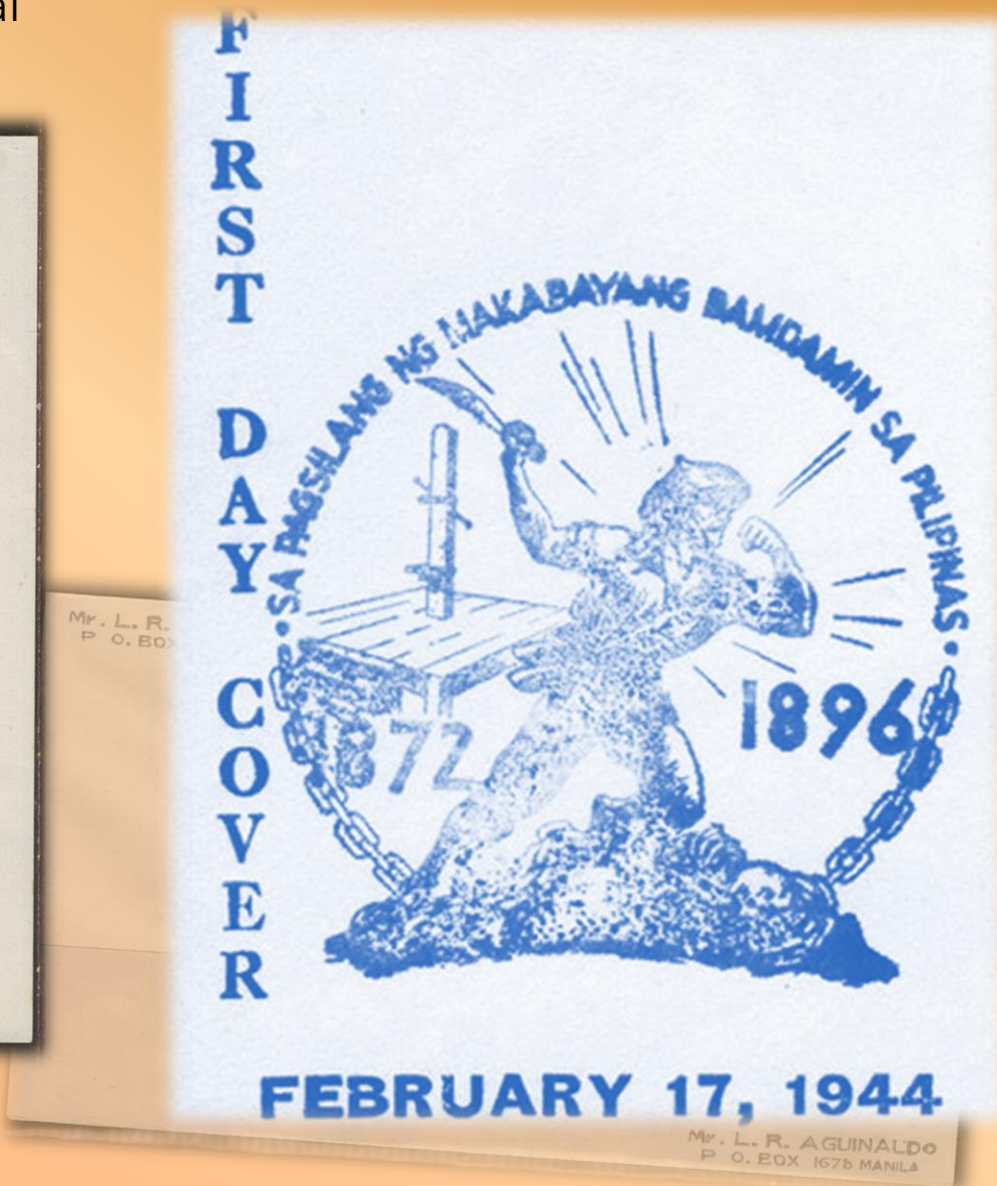

- The regular issue stamps, in perforated sheets (with gum) and imperforate (without gum) went on sale **on February 17th**, being issued while still under Japanese Occupation.
- This Souvenir Sheet paid tribute to **three martyrs** of the Filipino Revolutionary Government (1898-1901):
 - José Rizal (5c Blue) - a political activist and writer
 - Rev. José Burgos (12c Carmine) - a Catholic priest
 - Apolinario Mabini (17c Orange) - a national hero

The use of the **National Heroes Cancel** was allowed by the Postal Authorities from February 9, 1944 to February 16, 1944 (see Bullet Points 1&3)
