

National Airmail Week in Lebanon County



In last May's newsletter, we remembered National Airmail Week, which was held from May 15 – May 21, 1938. This cover design for LEBPEX '97 commemorated the event. Several of our local Post Offices participated in the national celebration, and on the following pages are some of the cachet designs that were flying around Lebanon County during that week almost 85 years ago



Lebanon's National Airmail Week cachet was designed by the Lebanon Aero-Philatelic Collectors Club, and featured one of the County's most famous landmarks, the Union Canal Tunnel.



Myerstown's cachet depicted a rendering of their most prominent historic landmark, the Isaac Meyer house.



Schaefferstown proudly depicted one of their most significant historical achievements on their National Airmail week cachet.



Palmyra paid tribute to their founder, Dr. John Palm.



Campbelltown utilized a uniform cachet, which incorporated a keystone and the capitol dome in Harrisburg. I use the term "uniform", for want of a better term, because you'll see this design again on a couple of the other cachets pictured.




Richland's cachet had wings! This also looks like it might have been a "uniform" cachet design.



Cornwall's busy cachet, signed by the pilot who flew the cover. This might have been the only time in the century of airmail service in the United States that a cover was sent from Cornwall to Lebanon, a distance of about five miles, via airmail!



Cornwall's next-door neighbor to the west, Quentin, used the "uniform" cachet. Without a pilot's signature, it's hard to prove that this cover was flown to its recipient in Cornwall.



Our neighbors to the south, Lancaster, incorporated their city's flower into the design of their cachet.



Harrisburg's design incorporates the familiar keystone and capitol dome.



And finally, a cover from Bethlehem, "The Christmas City of the U.S.A." One week in the history of the United States Postal Service provided us with many interesting event covers to collect.
